Message from the Mayor

Dear Residents:

We will be building our fifth park in Round Lake Heights. The park will be located on Tomahawk Trail, it should be done sometime in September. This park is a joint venture between the Village of Round Lake Heights and the Round Lake Area Park District. The park will be similar to the one in the Fox Glen Subdivision.

The well station on Cedarwood Circle is almost completed. The only work that remains to be completed is the fence and landscaping.

Our next Texas Hold'Em Tournament will be on July 21, 2007 on Village Hall grounds. This event will also include a Casino Night. 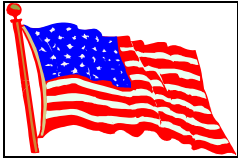

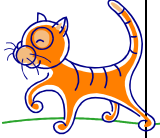

CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS

IT'S THE NEW STATE LAW

What this means for you as a resident is, as of January 1, 2007, every dwelling unit shall be equipped with at least one approved carbon monoxide alarm in operating condition within 15 feet of every room used for sleeping purposes. Homeowners are responsible for the installation of the detector. For rental units, installation is the landlord's responsibility.



YARD WASTE PICK-UP will begin April 1, 2007 and continue through November 30, 2007. Residents may set out up to four (4) parcels of yard waste per week. Each parcel must have a yard waste sticker.

YARD WASTE STICKERS for yard waste bag/containers are \$1.35 per sticker. Stickers can be purchased at Round Lake Heights Village Hall or at Jensen Disposal in Mundelein.

YARD WASTE SEASONAL SUBSCRIPTION includes weekly pick-up of up to four (4) parcels of yard waste (April – November) for a flat fee of \$71.00.

- All grass clippings, leaves and plant matter (50lbs. max) should be placed in brown paper yard waste bags or plastic garbage containers clearly marked "yard waste". Dirt and sod are not accepted.
- All branches and twigs should be tied in bundles of brush. Each branch or twig should not be larger than 2" in diameter and 4' in length
- **Residents should not place garbage, recycling or yard waste at the curb before 6pm on the night before the scheduled pick-up date.**



CLARK MOSQUITO CONTROL

Individuals can take the following steps to protect themselves against infection and assist in the fight against West Niles Virus:

- If outdoors when mosquitos are active, dress in light-colored, long-sleeved clothing, long pants and socks when outdoors during prime mosquito hours. Apply mosquito repellent with DEET to clothing and exposed skin in accordance with label directions.
- Discard any outdoor container that might hold water, or empty water form wading pools and bird baths once a week.
- Keep grass cut short and shrubbery well-trimmed around the house so adult mosquitoes will not hide there.
- Since dead birds (crows and blue jays) can be the first warning the West Niles Virus is present in the area, report dead birds on your property to your county health department.
